


The Board will also be supporting National Safeguarding Adults Week which is taking place from 16th-22nd November 2020. Further information will be shared in the next edition.

Annual Survey Results 2019-20

The Board's Annual Survey 2019-20 was completed by 740 members of the public and professionals. Thank you to those who completed it. The feedback from each survey has been collated to provide an overall view, illustrated below, however it should be noted that there were some differences between the responses from professionals and the general public. The results will help the Board to develop the Strategic Plan for 2020-21. Further detailed analysis is published as part of the Annual Communication and Engagement Report.



'Keeping People Connected' Service
